



De Vloei

Zonnebeekseweg 98, 8900 Ypres

De Vloei is an eco-friendly neighborhood born in 2005 and located in the eastern area of leper. De Vloei takes various aspects of sustainability into account: social, economic, ecological and process-based. The floor plan of the neighborhood is green and open, with passive and low-energy houses, private and shared gardens, local plants and various meeting rooms. It is made of 250 different homes, both houses and apartments, which can be both for rented and purchased. The neighborhood is car-free, with various parking ports per residential block and narrow roads that connect the residential areas. The water management is implemented through a green-blue stream of canals, buffer ponds and wadis store rainwater locally.

20:00 Last Post Ceremony

Menin Gate Menenstraat, 8900 leper

The Last Post, traditionally the last salute to those who fell, is being played under the Menin Gate by the clarion players of the Last Post Association, every evening at 8 p.m. This clarion call has been given since 1928 in honour of the British and Allied soldiers who fell in the Ypres Salient during WW I. The latter was allied territory, jutting out into German occupied terrain. But on 'the other side' also, many lost their lives. Former enemies, today we're all partners in a united Europe, turning the Last Post sounding into a signal of hope for the future.










Below the directions to get to Menin Gate from Albion Hotel
